

Job Title: Hospital Intern (Multiple)

**Location:** Multiple locations in area of Boston, MA

**Organization:** Sociedad Latina (sponsor matching interns to local hospitals)

The program provides young adults with the opportunity to find meaningful careers in the healthcare industry through paid internships at nearby participating institutions. Career paths could include, but are not limited to the following: Biomedical Technology, Information Technology, and Optical Technology. These healthcare facilities currently include Brigham and Women's, Beth Israel, Children's, and New England Baptist Hospital. Participants will also engage in Work Force Readiness trainings such as interviewing skills, resume writing, communication styles, leadership, etc. to better prepare them for entering into a competitive labor market.

## **Internship Overview:**

Internship Duration: September 28th - May 30th

**Time Commitment:** 10 hours/week

**Workforce Readiness Trainings:** Mon. – Thu. for 10 hours/week (typically, 4:00-6:30pm) during first 6-8 weeks and then once a week for 2.5 hours/week during internship

**Internship:** Mid-Nov. – May for 10 hours/week; with weekly shift schedule determined by department and student

**Pay Rate:** \$9 per hour paid every 2 weeks. Payment includes time for trainings and internship hours.

**Intern Responsibilities:** Intern roles & responsibilities will vary depending upon the specific hospital and department assignment. Departments may include the following, among others: ER, Radiology, ICU, Surgical Specialties, Patient Access–Surgery, Spine Center, Patient Care, Family & Youth Programs, Frontline Admin Team, Asthma Research, Asthma & Lung, Central Transport, Dentistry, Optical Shop, ect.



## **Intern Qualifications:**

- Age 18-23
- High school graduate
- Boston resident
- Available to commit to 10 hours a week and, for the first 8 weeks, a Monday-Thursday work schedule (typically, 4pm-6:30pm) for Workforce Readiness Trainings. Once placed into the internship, work shift schedules can be adjusted.
- Able to provide payroll paperwork (i.e. birth certificate, social security card, proof of income, Boston resident, proof of family size, etc)
- Interested in getting professional experience working in a hospital setting
